We turned to the Oncology Nursing Foundation to guide us with the establishment of a scholarship in her memory. Within 8 months, family, friends, and colleagues raised over \$35,000.00. The Sandy Purl Mentorship Scholarship was established in 2011.

The purpose of the scholarship is to provide \$1000.00 per year to allow an additional chapter member to attend Leadership Conference. This lifetime scholarship supports Sandy's legacy and her love of oncology nursing and mentorship.

The 2016 recipient was Tara Hinnenkamp RN, OCN®. She is the treasurer of the West Central Minnesota Chapter. Tara now has the bragging rights as the sixth recipient of this mentorship scholarship. The scholarship process includes a short essay on your goals for attending the Leadership Conference. The following is an excerpt from Tara's application:


